Early Implementation Highlights

Small Area and Neighborhood Planning

The Department of City Planning will begin releasing guidance on the new program for small area and neighborhood plans in the fall of 2025. The Department will work with NPUs and partners on initial planning efforts and continually improve the program based on early lessons and feedback.

Updating the Comprehensive Transportation Plan

Plan <u>A</u>'s transportation vision and goals will guide the Atlanta's Comprehensive Transportation Plan update starting later this year. The Department of City Planning is a key partner to ensure connections are made between mobility, land use, and other priorities. In addition to participating in the plan update through 2026, the Department of City Planning will continue to collaborate with ATLDOT to plan and implement transportation projects and initiatives.

Early Implementation Highlights (continued)

Aligning with ATL Zoning 2.0

ATL Zoning 2.0 creates opportunities for Atlanta's new land use approach in Plan <u>A</u>. The Department of City Planning will coordinate initial small area and neighborhood planning efforts and upcoming quarterly CDP amendments with testing the new Zoning Ordinance and Development Patterns over the next year. When the new Zoning Ordinance is adopted and in effect, these efforts can inform future changes to the Zoning Map.

Outreach and Education

Comprehensive planning is ongoing. The Department of City Planning is committed to strengthening relationships and fostering a shared understanding with NPUs, partners, and the community regarding all aspects of Plan <u>A</u>. Stay involved and join upcoming community involvement, such as NPU University courses and Conversations with Planners.

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What is new in Plan <u>A</u>?

A New Land Use Approach

Plan A combines the best aspects of Future Land Use and Character Area planning into a cohesive and consistent layer called Development Patterns to guide physical growth and development.

Alignment with ATL Zoning 2.0

The rewrite of Atlanta's 40-year-old Zoning Ordinance supports Plan A and the new land use approach, creating tools for customizing zoning to meet specific local needs.

Laying the Groundwork for Coordinated Small Area and Neighborhood Planning

Plan A proposes the development of a Small Area and Neighborhood Planning Program that empowers communities to develop actionable design, equity, and livability recommendations. It aims to establish a process with clear and transparent expectations and encourages greater community participation in shaping neighborhood futures.

What is new in Plan A? (continued)

Housing for All

This Plan A update emphasizes strategies to leverage public resources such as land and local funds to ensure widespread housing affordability and opportunities for all Atlantans citywide.

Designing Atlanta's Public Realm

Plan A sees the relationship between the public realm and people's lives. It includes many recommendations to activate and enhance the public realm with art, monuments, public spaces, interpretative wayfinding, and public and private investments to contribute to Atlanta's natural, cultural, social, and civic identity.

Creating a More Resilient Atlanta

This Plan A update supports initiatives that invest in our environment, like implementing *Climate Resilient ATL*, *Activate ATL*, and *Trails ATL*.

How does Plan <u>A</u> fit into other planning efforts?

Plan A advances valuable recommendations from numerous efforts and initiatives conducted by the City of Atlanta and many of its implementing partners, like those below.



Plan A will guide the development and implement new regional, city, and neighborhood plans.
